## THIS WEEK'S SAINTS

**Monday** – St Elizabeth of Hungary was a very strong woman who raised a family and helped to rule a kingdom in what we still call the “middle ages.” She did this in such a Christian spirit of love for the poor that she is honoured as a saint of the Church.

**Tuesday** – Dedication of the Basilicas of St Peter and St Paul. We remember the foundations of our Catholic faith as we honour the two great apostles of Christ who gave their lives at Rome and whose memory is preserved in these two great churches.

**Friday** – The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary recalls the moment in Mary's young life when she was dedicated to God by her parents Joachim and Anna in the temple at Jerusalem – a moment in the history of our salvation.

**Saturday** – St Cecilia was honoured as a virgin martyr of the early church. You can search the very beautiful and moving image of her uncorrupted body as sculpted by Maderno. For various reasons she became the patron saint of music
