Welcome back after the Christmas season. You will be able to enjoy our crib until 2 February, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Luke 2.22-38).

In the second reading today St Paul writes about the body being made up of various parts. After the exams you might feel like all-brain (or no-brain) or all-hand (unused to writing). In the next few weeks there will be several retreats to remind you of your spirit.

There will be **weekend retreats** for the RCIA group, the altar servers and the SVP group. In addition, there will be a **week of guided prayer** open to all students beginning on *Sunday 14th February at 4.30pm*. During the week you continue to do most of your normal activities, but you give at least half an hour a day to prayer and another half hour a day to meet with

a prayer guide.

The week will be led by Steve Hoyland who came in December to help us prepare for Christmas with three workshops. On *Wednesday evenings 5-6pm*, beginning on *3rd February* there will be a **weekly prayer workshop**, following a similar pattern to Steve's workshops. The prayer will use one of the readings for the following Sunday.

Praying with the readings before Mass can help you get more from them during Mass and can help you to realise when the scripture is being fulfilled in your own life as it was when Jesus proclaimed it in the synagogue in the gospel today (Luke 4.21). You may become more aware of how the Holy Spirit is at work in your own life.

THIS WEEK'S SAINTS

Monday – The Conversion of St Paul marks the "second founding" of the Church. As Peter was the leader and the centre of the mission to Israel, so Paul became the apostle to the world. His letters to the early churches are the first documents that show what a Christian life is all about.

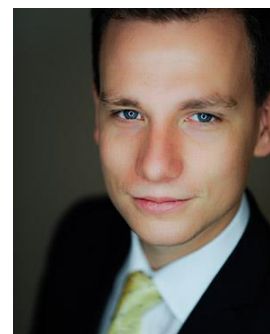
Tuesday – SS Timothy and Titus are mentioned in the New Testament writings as founders of new churches at the time of the Apostles. They represent the next generation of Christians and the importance of apostolic succession.

Thursday – St Thomas Aquinas was the greatest Catholic philosopher of the middle ages and is a patron saint of students. In his voluminous works he united Faith and Reason, the "two wings" that carry us to Truth.
