THIS WEEK'S SAINTS

Monday – The Feast of the Presentation commemorates the presentation of Mary as a little girl in the Temple. Today is called "Candlemas" because on this day we bless the candles that will be used throughout the coming year. There will be a blessing of candles at every mass today.

Tuesday – St Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, is invoked for the blessing of throats. There will be a blessing of throats after each mass.

Wednesday – Jesuit Martyrs of the Missions: we remember Jesuit missionaries of the 18th and 19th centuries who gave their lives for Christ in many lands.

Thursday – St Agatha is one of many Virgin Martyrs of the early Church and their heroism is perpetuated in the canon of the Mass.

Friday – Paul Miki and the martyrs of Japan: 26 Christians, including Jesuit and Franciscan missionaries alongside Japanese catechists, were crucified in Nagasaki in 1597 under a cruel suppression.
