## This Week's Saints

**Monday** – St Peter Canisius was a Jesuit preacher, theologian and administrator at the time of the Counter-reformation. His untiring apostolic efforts and his great sanctity helped keep Bavaria and Austria from becoming Lutheran territories.

**Wednesday** – St Catherine of Siena is a doctor of the Church and was a great fighter for the integrity of the Papacy during the time of the papal schism and the control of the Popes by the French. Although a mystic, she was very politically active!

**Friday** – Today we honour St Joseph the Worker and we remember the carpenter's shop in Nazareth and the years that Jesus spent there sharing manual work with his foster- father. This day is a tribute to all who earn a living by their physical labour and technical skills.

**Saturday** – St Athanasius was a bishop of Alexandria and a great defender of the Faith against the Arian heresy, which denied the full divinity of Christ and the pure doctrine of the Trinity. He is one of the Fathers of the Church and the author of one of the official Catholic creeds.

A “pastoral landscape” is a painterly scene of rural tranquillity, but the pastoral life is a hard calling. Pastor means shepherd and a shepherd’s work is to keep watch over the flock, to care for them and to feed them (“pasture”). A good shepherd knows his sheep and calls them by name. They know him and trust him. He seeks the ones that are lost. He sacrifices himself on their behalf. We speak of our clergy as pastors, but every Christian has a pastoral role.
