Monday - Angela Merici gathered a group of young women around her to live a life dedicated to the service of the poor; after her death in 1540 this became the great teaching order of the Ursulines.

Tuesday - Thomas Aquinas (13th century) is the preeminent theologian of the Catholic Church; his insights into the relationship between faith and reason are an enduring source of study and reflection.

Friday - John Bosco worked tirelessly to provide care and education for boys living in the streets of Italy's industrial cities, he created structures of support and a new religious order: the Salesians.
