THIS WEEK'S SAINTS

Monday – St Wenceslaus is the patron saint of the Czech Republic. Although a powerful noble, he fought for the independence of the Church and was martyred by his political opponents in 935.

Tuesday – The Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael represent the host of heavenly powers who remind us of God's transcendence but also of His loving involvement in human history.

Wednesday – St Jerome is the great ascetic of the 4th century whose translation of the entire Bible into Latin provided the standard version for the Western Church.

Thursday – St Therese of Lisieux was a Carmelite nun whose autobiography and whose "little way" have inspired millions of Christians. She died in 1897.

Friday – The Guardian Angels are mentioned by Christ Himself and are a constant presence as heavenly friends and intercessors for each Christian soul.

Saturday – St Francis Borgia was the third General of the Society of Jesus and his holy way of life helped redeem the family name which he inherited.




