THIS WEEK SAINTS

Monday – Saint Jerome, the great ascetic of the early church, whose translation of the Bible into Latin (The Vulgate) became the standard version of scripture for the Catholic Church until our own times.

Tuesday – Saint Therese of the Child Jesus (Lisieux), the Carmelite nun from the late 19th and early 20th century, whose "Little Way" and whose autobiography have been an inspiration for millions. She is the patron saint of missions and her writings have earned her the title of Doctor of the Church.

Wednesday – Holy Guardian Angels. We have the authority of Jesus himself, that each one of God's children is under the protection of an Angel in Heaven. Let us pray to ours'!

Thursday – Saint Francis Borgia, third superior general of the Jesuit Order, a man whose saintliness helped redeem the Borgia name.

Friday – Saint Francis of Assisi, a much loved saint both within the church and outside it, he brought the spirit of Christ to the church of his time through his love of poverty and his celebration of God's presence all around us. Gives his name to our current Pope.
