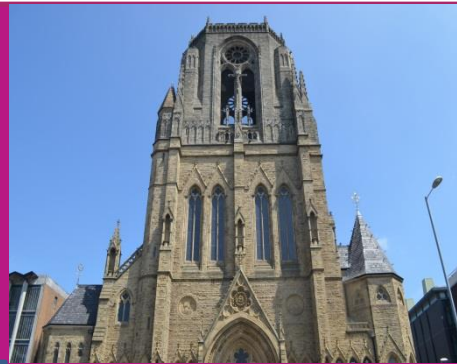

Preparing for Easter

Please take note that during the Easter Vacations we will be only having one daily mass in the Holy Name. So from **Saturday April 5th** – **Saturday April 26th** there will be no daily 6pm mass in the chaplaincy. Also today will be the final 7pm Sunday mass and 9.15am Sunday mass till Sunday April 27th.

So next Sunday April 6th there will only be the 12pm mass here at the Holy Name.
