Monday – St Bruno was a great reformer of the Medieval Church. After excelling as a scholar, he turned to a life of solitude and prayer and eventually gathered around him a community that became the Carthusian Order. Let's be inspired by his example of silence and prayer.

Tuesday – Our Lady of the Rosary: The word "rosary" means a garland of roses and tradition tells us that this wonderful way of praying was given by Our Lady to St Dominic. You can learn about the rosary on-line but basically it is a prayer of meditation on the life of Christ and a way of offering intercession on behalf of others. October is the month of the Rosary. 

CLC Information Evening

Christian Life Communities (CLC) information evening, Thursday October 9th at 7pm in the Chaplaincy. CLC is a worldwide family of small groups meeting regularly to pray and to share their experience of God in their daily lives. There are 60 national communities and over 50 groups in England. The chaplaincy has one group already and we are hoping to start a second one. We follow a pattern of prayer and Scripture reflection using material prepared by the CLC national team and based on the spiritual tradition of St Ignatius Loyola. The aim is to discover and deepen our spirituality by "finding God in all things" through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. These are not discussion groups but sharing something of our spiritual life with others – and respectfully listening to one another – is essential to the process. Foodbank's First Birthday!

The Foodbank celebrated its First Year Anniversary last Thursday and so we wanted to share some of its success over the last 12 months with you! We have fed over 1,700 people who have been referred by close to 100 different agencies operating over the city-centre. Students and friends have distributed over 13 tonnes of food to people in crisis. Do you want to make a difference?
